## 6TH ANNUAL FAMILY CAMP AND REVIVAL SERVICE AUGUST 25-27, 1989 WITH ED BOUSMAN

The last weekend in August, the 25-27th, C/A will host its annual C/A FAMILY CAMP AND REVIVAL SERVICES. Friday night at 7:00, Saturday morning at 11:15 a.m., and again Saturday night at 7:00 Ed Bousman will speak on the theme, "BACK TO THE BASICS." Ed is a premiere preacher in our brotherhood, nationally known and respected. Through both his radio and TV ministry broadcast across most of the nation, Ed echoes the messages of N.T. Christianity almost every day of the week. You will miss a treat if you miss Ed Bousman!

In addition to this grand preaching, we will have workshops again highlighting our theme "Back to the Basics..Evangelism,..The Cross,..The Devil,..The Resurrection,..The Second Coming, and The Christian Family." These workshops will be held Saturday morning. At the same time we will have lessons and crafts for 1-6th grade and a special sessions for teens. There will be plenty of recreation all Saturday afternoon.

Sunday night, as in the past 5 years, we will have the ALL AREA GOSPEL SING. Any group from our supporting and member churches that would like to sing, please contact me for a slot on the program. It will begin at 7:00 and end approximately at 8:30. This gathering is the largest gathering of Christians in the state of W.Va. from several churches. **PLAN NOW TO CAMP OUT WITH US OR COMMUTE OVER FOR THE FAMILY CAMP AND REVIVAL SERVICES!** We're counting on YOU!

**NOTE THE SCHEDULE OF EVENTS ELSEWHERE IN THE CHRONICLE. SPECIAL NOTE:** This is FAMILY camp - all youngsters staying on campus must be accompanied by an adult or under adult supervision.

There is no charge for family camp except for those camping out. The fee of 85¢ per person staying on campus is to cover the insurance. We plead with out supporting churches to transfer NOT CANCEL their services to the C/A campus for that evening. Communion will be served that evening for those who didn't have a chance to partake that morning.
