CAMP TO OFFER ADULT SWIMMING LESSONS AND LIFE-GUARDING CLASS TO THOSE 15 OR OLDER

July 27-August 7th, C/A Lifeguards Chris Cardinal and Joanna Mathena will offer swimming lessons for adults. A Free-will donation will be taken at the end of the class. Classes will be held each weekday evening from 7-8 except Wednesdays.

Also Advanced Life saving will be offered for area teens 15 years or older and adults. The cost for this 42 hour class will be \$20 to cover the cost of books. The deadline for registering for the August 3-7, and August 17-21 classes is July 15th. Books must be ordered by that date to have them in for the first session on August 3rd. As part of the class, a multimedia first aid class and CPR will be taught. Those who pass will receive Red Cross Lifeguard Certification.
