By the time most of you receive this Chronicle, camp will be just two weeks away and it will be already too late to pre-register for the first week of camp on June 17th! **REMEMBER**, we must **RECEIVE THAT CAMP REGISTRATION CARD TWO WEEKS IN ADVANCE** so June 4th was the deadline! We would like to encourage each congregation to choose a **registration Sunday** and try to get all the campers who are planning on coming to camp to go ahead and register.

The deans have been working hard lining up an experienced faculty and challenging missionaries and a fine program for each week. If you desire to work their week give them a call soon, because most of them have a majority of their staff already committed.

Registration for each week of camp will be from 3-5 in the cafeteria. Please do not arrive much earlier so as to give this hungry camp manager time to eat his lunch. We try to encourage all the staff to be here 2:30 to be at their respective posts to greet you and show you where to go and what to do.

Each camper should bring a sack lunch for the evening meals. We would like to encourage the Moms and Dads to mark the clothing with at least the initials of the campers. Use indelible ink. We are desperately trying to cut down on the bushels of clothes left on the campus each summer!

PAVILLION WORKDAYS ARE JUNE 2 and JUNE 9

By the time you receive this Chronicle, Lord willing, the pavillion will be well on its way. As I type this Chronicle the ground has been cleared and the gravel dropped. It will settle for approximately two weeks before Saturday workdays. We have set aside June 2 and June 9 to build the pavillion. These two workdays should prepare most of the work needed on the pavillion.

We call upon all our area men to come June 2 beginning at 8:00 with your hammers, rakes, etc. Bring a sack lunch - C/A will provide the drinks. We will work into

the afternoon to prepare the pavillion site for forms to get ready to pour the concrete. In the week between June 2 and June 9, the second work Saturday, we will pour the concrete and prepare everything necessary to place the trusses, sheathing material and shingles on June 9th. The June 9th workday will also begin at 8:00 and we will work into the afternoon hours until we are finished.

With only two Saturdays called to begin and complete the pavillion, we call upon all our supporting churches to send us two or three men each. We depend on **YOU** to have us men to get this work done before camp!
