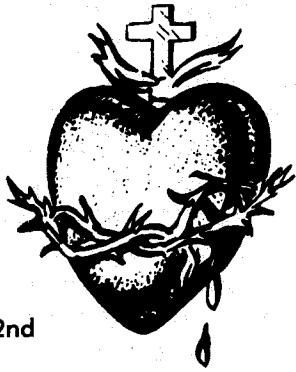

Another historic camp season is just around the corner for Christian Acres. With a 1 one-year increase of 63 campers last year, we are setting our sights on having 500 campers here this summer, up from 464 last year - and up from 187 in 1978! ### A FEW IMPORTANT NOTES ON CAMP FOR THIS SEASON:

1. Jr. I and II will close on Friday night at 8:30. First Chance will close on Tuesday night at 8:30. All other weeks will close on Saturday at 10:00
2. A camper is allowed one grade variance for his choice of week. For example a young man going into the seventh grade could also choose to come the 6th grade week or the 8th grade week, but not the 9th-10th grade week. This rule allows parents who have vacation plans for one week to send their child another week.
3. By pre-registering two weeks in advance you can save \$5 for a full week and \$2.50 for the First Chance week. Cards will be available from your local church by April 15th.

### **30 PIECES OF SILVER OFFERING SET FOR APRIL 22**

Our annual 30 Pieces of Silver Offering is just about 7 weeks away. The goal for the offering this year is \$4,000 - about \$400 more than what we actually received last year. The money will be used to help build the pavillion across the road from the pool near the lake. We already have \$2163 toward the construction provided through the Jesus Birthday offering taken in December from area congregations. In the past, the 30 Pieces of Silver offering has been about 3 times as large as the Jesus Birthday Offering. Counting the escavating work and set-up, the pavillion should cost between four and five thousand dollars. We ask all our supporting congregations to take this offering in behalf of C/A.
