Jay Meadows and crew had their hands full with 91 campers for Junior High week. The theme of their week was "We're the Image of our Father"--and it would have made you cry too to hear them sing their theme song! They got to stay up later-so did the camp manager to witness baptisms on night at 12:30!

We were bragging that we had had few major injuries--but spoke to soon. We had two stitches up at Jr. High, then in one day we had a chipped bone in a counselor's foot, a girl was practicing her Bible Drama and hit her head hard on the bottom of the pool, and then almost at 10:00 on Satuday a boy cut a gash in his head on a window at the dorm.
