The 5th Annual C/A Family Camp is rapidly approaching - - and I can feel the excitement building in the area already. Our featured speaker is David Vaughn from Lynchburg, VA. "Mr Don Rickles of the Restoration Movement', David will thrill your heart with his humorous but hard-hitting sermons, dazzle the youngsters with his gospel magic, and captivate us with his singing accompanied by his guitar.

This family weekend will feature a Saturday afternoon hayride, a weiner roast for everyone at 5:00 on Saturday evening, plenty of family recreation - - a spiritual feast on the Word!
